

MRS. SWANZY IS AGAIN NAMED TO HEAD AUXILIARY

Annual Meeting of Outrigger Club Branch Shows Society in Good Condition

Mrs. F. M. Swanzy, who has held the office since initial organization six years ago, was reelected president of the Woman's Auxiliary of the Outrigger Club at the annual meeting of that society yesterday afternoon. About 40 members were present.

Other officers chosen to serve during the coming fiscal year were Mrs. Andrew Fuller, vice-president; Mrs. Isaac M. Cox, second vice-president; Mrs. W. A. Wall, secretary, and Miss Elizabeth J. Jones, treasurer. The new directors for the year will be Mrs. J. A. Gilman, Mrs. Eben Low, Mrs. John Sojer, Mrs. W. J. MacNeil, Mrs. Alfred Rasch, Mrs. A. G. Smith and Miss Marie Ehrhorn.

In a brief address, Mrs. Swanzy outlined the work done by the auxiliary during the last year, reporting that financial conditions are excellent and that membership affairs are as good as could be desired. The organization now has a limited membership of 500, including 465 townsfolk and 35 service members. The waiting list now contains the names of more than 200 persons.

There was some discussion regarding the stream which flows into the ocean at the waikiki boundary of the club's premises at the beach. Some of the members were of the opinion that the stream should be diverted, as it discourages bathing in that vicinity. Others favored the retaining of the stream, stating that, if it is removed, the growth of coral will be promoted at its mouth. One officer says that the general opinion seems to be that the stream should be made smaller and cleaner.

Mrs. Theodore Richards reported that she had interviewed Superintendent of Public Works Charles R. Forbes regarding the stream, but that he was unable to give her any definite information as to what will finally be done with it.
