

MANY OUTRIGGER MEMBERS MAY BE DROPPED MONDAY

Non-Payment of Dues Renders 42 Liable to Dismissal From Membership

Unless they "come through" before Monday with the \$5 each they owe the organization, 42 members of the Outrigger Canoe Club, including a judge, a minister, a druggist, a prominent educator and others will probably be dropped from membership in the club for non-payment of semi-annual dues, according to J. Ashman Beaven, its secretary.

At a meeting of the board of directors, which will be held Monday, April 10, all members whose dues for the current half-year ending June 30 have not been paid, will have their names brought up for action and probable dismissal from membership.

"Twenty new members have come in since January 1," says Mr. Beaven. "This about offsets the resignations, so that we are still crowded for locker room. After we take action on the names of those who have not paid their dues for the current half-year, we will probably have a lot of lockers immediately available, so that doubling up will not be necessary any longer. We now have 40 or 50 members sharing their lockers with new members.
