

# MOVIE MAN SNAPS WAIKIKI PICTURES

## Surf-riders and Outriggers Are 'Caught Close Up' By Joseph De Frenes

One part of the motion picture entitled "On the Beach At Waikiki," which is to be shown throughout the United States late this year, was taken at the beach yesterday afternoon by Joseph de Frenes, the expert camera man sent to Hawaii by the Lyman H. Howe Bureau.

The photographer obtained what he believes will prove remarkably fine action pictures of the surf-riders and canoe races. The billows were running very high and close to the diving platform, on which de Frenes, with the assistance of Outrigger Canoe Club members, was able to station his machine. He "caught" a large number of surf-riders "close up," traveling at top speed ahead of the combers. He also filmed five or six outrigger canoes in action, all well filled with men and women.

Despite the weather, which was a little cloudy, he thinks the films upon development will show the water scenes clearly.

Because of the clouds and the consequent fact that the number of bathers was not as large as customary, he did not attempt to take beach pictures, but will try it today if the weather is propitious.

The Promotion Committee, realizing that the films will be one of Hawaii's big advertising assets is assisting Mr. de Frenes, and urges Honolulu people to turn out, if the sun shines, and help make the crowd at the beach a big one.

The films are to be displayed by seven traveling companies for seven months, beginning early in August. The displays handled by the Howe Bureau are educational travelogues of a high class, showing scenes of interest from all the distant parts of the world. The photographer who has been sent to Hawaii is said to possess more than ordinary ability and experience in filming topical pictures, having taken the great series of views of the Durbar at Delhi and cinema color pictures of Lillian Russell and many other world celebrities of the stage, politics and governments.

He obtained views of the gardens at Moanalua Friday and expects to go into the country tomorrow for some rural and mountain scenery. He already has visited Hilo and the living volcano, and will go to Maui shortly to obtain views of Haleakala.
