

BIG CLOCK NOW IS PROPERTY OF OUTRIGGER CLUB

Wichman's Street Timepiece Soon Will Adorn Beach; Chimes Planned, Too

Within the next 30 days or less it will be possible for Outrigger members standing on the diving platform or riding outrigger canoes a quarter of a mile from the clubhouse to tell the time of day without toting watches around in their bathing suits.

This has been made possible by the presentation to the club by H. F. Wichman & Company, Ltd., of their big street clock, for many years a Fort street landmark. The company has donated the clock to the Outrigger Club, and the club's directors, at a meeting this week, accepted the gift with pleasure.

In place of the Wichman emblem now on the clock, the words "Outrigger Canoe Club" will be emblazoned. As a token of appreciation for the handsome gift, the club will probably have the words "Presented by H. F. Wichman & Company, Ltd.," placed on the dial.

The present clock has a dial not large enough to be seen more than 100 yards away, but the new clock's dial is so big that passengers on steamers going out or coming in past the clubhouse, out at sea, will probably be able to see the hours on the dial, if they use field glasses.

The clock will have a special base constructed for it, so that it will be about the same height from the beach that it now is from the sidewalk on Fort street.

In addition to the fine new grandfather-sized timepiece, the club is planning to put up a ship's clock on the dancing lanai, with an electrically-operated gong arrangement to strike the bells on a big triangle.

With all these improvements in operation, it will be possible for Outriggerites to have all kinds of time around them, land time, nautical time and a good time
