

OUTRIGGER CLUB MAKES NEW RULE TO STOP TIPPING

Giving Tips Will Mean Expulsion of Member and Discharge of Employee

Woe be to any member who tries to tip employes of the Outrigger Club, or any employe who accepts a tip!

An anti-tipping rule has been adopted by the club's board of directors, among a set of new house and ground rules, and may lead to an anti-tipping crusade among other clubs in the city. It is being strictly enforced.

The new rule, notice of which is now conspicuously posted on the Outrigger grounds and has met with the hearty approval of members, reads as follows:

"Any servant or employe who accepts any tip, or cash gratuity in any form, will be discharged from the service of the club.

"Any member of the club who offers to any club servant or employe of the club any tip or cash gratuity in any form will be immediately expelled from the club. Members will be held strictly responsible for any infraction of the rule by guests."

Another new rule effective now is that dealing with service after 7 p. m. At that hour a servant is available to assist members in preparing and serving meals, at the rate of 5 cents for each person served per hour or fraction, with a minimum charge of 25 cents.

The clause dealing with taking out of outrigger canoes has a bearing on tips as well. It says:

"Members acting as steersmen or paddlers are not allowed to charge any fee for such service."

Chairman G. K. Larrison of the house committee invites members to submit criticisms and suggestions relative to the new rules.
