Waikiki Becoming More Popular For Swimming, Surfing and Fishing

all along the beach from Fort De Rus-sey to the Queen's place near the old sea wall. Morning or afternoon, it is almost impossible for one to find a minute of the day at Waikiki when there is not some one in the water.

Many Surfers At Waikiki

Not only is there a large increase in the number of swimmers at Waikiki but there is also a larger number of surfers on surf boards and in outrigger canoes. Particularly is this noticeable among the younger boys, most ly members of the Outrigger Cance Club. These youngsters are taking advantage of their vacation time to learn the old Hawaiian art of riding the breakers. It is to be expected that in the ranks of these younger frequenters of the beach there are some future world beaters in the swimming game.

Fishing is also becoming more in favor off Waikiki. Often a party will take an outrigger cance, got two or three old Hawaiian spears and a glass box and go out to the reef to fish in true Hawaiian style. The results obtained by some of these younthful disciples of Isaak Walton are often not as good as might be wished but then the fishermen have had their half day's sport. In addition to the other sports al-ready mentioned, sailing is sometimes indulged in. One of the most fascinat-ing sports in the Islands is sailing in an outrigger canoe with a sufficiently large sail and with a good breeze. Then too, there are devotees of the canvas canoe, of which there are several along the beach. Most interest of all, however, is shown in surfing. This is particularly true since the surf has been getting bigger since the middle of last week.
