

A. A. U. MEET WILL START ON FRIDAY

Program Set Forward One Day; Plans Nearly Complete For Ha- waii's Big Swimming Carnival

Preparations for the biggest swimming meet that Honolulu has ever seen and one of the biggest ever held in the United States, are now practically complete. The dates finally set for the swimming meet, after consultation with the naval and military authorities, will be Friday, September 1, Saturday September 2 and Monday, September 4. The first race will be promptly called at eight o'clock next Friday evening and from then on, the program, as already outlined, will be carried to completion.

Swimmers Arrive Tuesday

The three champion mainland swimmers, Langer, Cann and Vollmer, will arrive here on the Wilhelmina, docking early Tuesday morning. The band will be on the wharf to greet them and a special committee headed by Mayor Lane will board the Wilhelmina off port and welcome them to Honolulu. It is very probable that W. T. Rawlins, president of the local association, who is now in San Francisco, will accompany the swimmers here.

Entries for all of the events to be contested close this afternoon at five o'clock at the office of the Hawaiian News Co. Ltd., and unless entries have been duly filed with J. F. Soper by that time, there will be no chance to compete in any of the events. This is especially important to be observed as, in the novice and service races where the entries' interests are not being looked after by regular clubs, they may not understand fully what is necessary to be done.

Seats Now On Sale

All seats on the naval pier will be reserved and seats are being sold on this pier now at the Hawaiian News Co., and will be on sale until the day of the races. Already over 400 seats have been purchased and it looks as if there would be very few left when the gates open next Friday. The seats on the military pier will be thrown open to the public at fifty cents each. None of these seats will be reserved and it will be simply a matter of coming early in order to obtain one. There will be a general admission charge of twenty-five cents which pays for standing room only.
