TONIGHT'S CARD BEST OF CARNIVAL

Spectators will have an opportunity to see the champion mermen from the Coast and those of the Islands fight for places in two events tonight at the naval slip. The last event on the program the 440-yard Hawaiian championship will probably be of the greatest interest because all the mainland swimmers will appear. Langer holds the record at this distance and seems confident of retaining his laurels, but Duke is liable to spring one of his surprises and pull across the finish line first. Cann is best at the five hundred, but as this event is only sixty yards short of his distance, he should make the champion hustle. Vollmer is a trifle above his distance in this event. Kruger and Cunha are going to give the champ a stiff battle for first honors for these two men are strong and good at the quarter.

220 Big Race

The first number on the card will hold second interest. This event, the 220-yard Hawaiian championship finds the pick of the natators entered. Duke and George Cunha hold the world's record for this distance jointly, making the eighth in 2:29. Kruger was a close third in the race in which this time was made and will give the champs a fight.

It cannot be expected that Duke and Cunha will swim to a tie again and the race for first this evening is bound to shatter the record. Lady Langer is good at this distance and his long, even stroke is going to make somebody hurry for the blue ribbon. Cann is not at his distance in this race, yet he will be heard from. Vollmer who is entered on the card will not complete because of the objection of the N. Y. A. C. Kelii must be reckoned with as he can give the champions a go at any time. Lane is above his distance here yet he a plucky swimmer and may nose out some of the favorites.

Boys Fast

In the fifty yard race for boys under fifteen Mitrie Konowaloff seems to be the pick of the field, although Subotine and Hjorth can do the half century in record time and it will be anybody's race until the finish.

There is little doubt as to the outcome of the 100 yard Championship. Duke naturally is at his best in the century and is the easy favorite. Lane, Kruger, Cunha and Kelii should put up a pretty battle for the second honors.

The 100 yard service race has a large list of entries with anybody picked as the winner.

In the 100 yard girl's race the order of finishing will undoubtedly be as it was last night.
