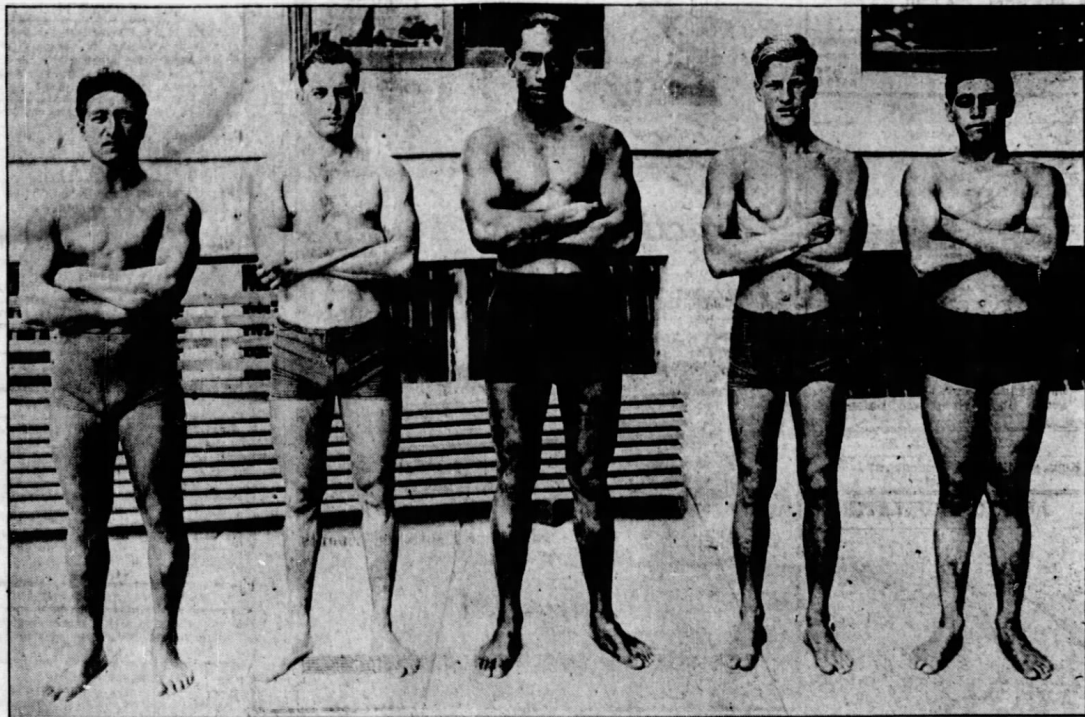


Five Honolulu Swimmers Who Challenge The World



Honolulu presents these swimmers as the foremost aggregation that can be gathered together in any city in the world. Left to right—John Keili, new swimming marvel, who made a great showing on Saturday night on the harbor. He swam the 220 yards under 2:30 and finished second in the Hawaiian championship. In addition to these performances he made a great spurt in the 440 and finished third. Next, George Cunha, Hawaiian champion in the 100 yards, who won this event from John Keili and Clarence Lane. Cunha also tied for third place in the 220-yard swim. Duke P. Kahanamoku, world's champion, who equaled his world's record for the 100 yards and came within a fraction of setting a new mark for the 50-yard event. He tied for third in the furlong. Harold ("Stubby" Kruger, who made a new world's mark in the 100-yard back-stroke last evening. Clarence Lane, who was second to Duke Kahanamoku in a great race to the finish line last evening. Lane made the 100 in 0:54. These are Honolulu's best, and proved during the meeting that they were the best sprint swimmers in the world.
