

HONOLULU CLUBS AIDING IN WORK FOR BIG PAGEANT

**Outrigger Entry To Represent
Great Wave With Father
- Neptune In Command**

**AUSTRALIANS ALSO WILL
ENTER FLOATS IN PARADE**

**Japanese of Hawaii Plan Series
of Pictures Representing
Months of the Year**

Practically every club in town is co-operating with the Pan-Pacific workers to make the opening day of the 1917 Carnival a success. Already, in addition to those of two score of firms, entries of floats for the pageant have been made by as many clubs and hundred organizations, while another score of private citizens are showing their interest by guaranteeing \$100 each for a float either in the Hawaiian or Pan-Pacific section of the great parade.

Directors and members of the Outrigger Club have subscribed nearly \$200 toward the great forty-foot wide wave that Lionel Walden and Gordon Usborn are designing. This will bear Father Neptune in a canoe, as well as the surf-riders. Father Neptune will hold in leash with colored ribbons twenty giant Hawaiian fish, under which will be hidden bicycle riders, and nearly another hundred rainbow fish of the ocean will gambol besides these.

Clubs That Are Helping

The Trail and Mountain Club, through its members, has subscribed for a float that will show how the old Hawaiian royal messengers scaled mountain ranges; the A. A. U. will show on a float the athletes of the days of Kamehameha; the Automobile Club has raised in a day within a few dollars of the sum needed for its float, as have interested members of the University Club and the Y. M. C. A. The South is not on the Pacific, but its sons in Honolulu have pledged themselves for enough for one float in the Carnival, and offer still another.

The sons of California have promised three floats, and the Canadians here and their sons promise four floats at least from the Dominion.

The Ad Club swung in line an hour after it was made known that its members were expected to contribute a float, and at the rotary club last week when it was announced that any member subscribing \$10 to the Rotary float was promised immunity from appeals to the subscription fund of any other club of which he might be a member, the amount needed was over subscribed in a moment.

Everyone in town seems to be catching the spirit; interested friends of the Boy Scouts have entered a float in their name and the Hawaiians themselves are contributing liberally toward the Hawaiian floats.

Australia In Also

Australia will have seven floats representing the commonwealth and each of the states, while New Zealand is to have three floats, and the designs for these will be typical so that no one who sees the floats in the big Carnival pageant will mistake their origin. Tasmania, Victoria, New South Wales and Queensland have already begun to ship decorations and adornments for their particular floats.

The Filipinos have sent home for the materials with which their floats are to be built, and these will be unique as they are to be thoroughly typical of the Philippines. The Koreans are active in preparing for their two floats as are the Chinese, who promise four floats.

The floats of Japan are expected to create an artistic sensation as these are designed to represent the twelve months of the year, and in Japan, each month has its flower, its emblem and its representative bird or animal, and in addition to this Japan has a festival for each month of the year and these are to be represented on the floats.

Each of the hundred or more floats is to be built with a view to permanency, and the workers have practical assurance that every organization in town will give cooperation in making the pageant of February 19 the most distinctive thing of its kind ever offered at a Mid-Pacific Carnival or elsewhere about the big ocean.
