TUESDAY'S FIGHTING

GERMAN ARMY HEADOUAR-TERS. Nov 21.-Western arena. Crown Prince Rupprecht's front: Our artillery has won noticeable effects today in fighting the enemy. A lively hostile fire was directed against our positions at several places. There were no infantry engagements.

In Champagne and Meuse sector: Some artillery fighting revived.

Eastern arena. Prince Leopold's front: Nothing important.

Archduke Carl's front in the Carpathians: A patrol enterprise on the Lubova sector carried out as planned; 40 prisoners brought in. Russian advance failed. On the east edge of Transylvania only minor fighting.

Last night, north of Kampolung, we dispersed several Russian attacks. In Alt Valley we captured some important towns and entrenched heights. Our infantry is before Craiova, up to now the seat of the chief command of the Rumanian first army.

In the Balkans, von Mackensen's front: Nothing important except artillery fire. Constanza and Czernavoda shelled.

Our flyer squadrons bombarded a e tablishment near transportation Bucharest.

Macedonian front: Between Lake Presba and the Czerna river the enemy has been reaching with vanguards for German-Bulgarian posi-Serbian advances in some tions. places on Moglena front, prepared by strong tire, failed. On the flooded Struma plain only engagements of reconnoitring detachments.
