

Y. W. C. A. PLANNING BEACH CLUBHOUSE FOR NEAR FUTURE

Plans Announced at "Publicity Luncheon" Given By Association Officers and Staff

Announcement was made today by Miss Helen Salisbury, acting general secretary of the Y. W. C. A., at a luncheon given by the officers of the association and members of the staff, that the association would establish a large beach club at Waikiki in the very near future.

In the course of her discussion at the meeting outlining the plans for the budget this year, Miss Salisbury told of plans made for a large building at the beach which will accommodate 400 members. A lot, 50x300 feet, has been secured from the Damons, between Fort De Russy and the Gray residence.

It is planned to erect a building which will contain 400 lockers, facilities for lunches with a kitchen, and in addition a tennis court will be erected. A chaperone will be in attendance at all times, and both swimming instructors and tennis tutors will be secured for the beach home.

There has been a crying need for such a building, as many of the Y. W. C. A. members have been unable to secure lockers at the Outrigger Club, and consequently the association has made arrangements for a building of its own. The bathing beach near the Hau Tree is perhaps the best on the beach, there being two rafts at present in the waters adjoining the property.

At the meeting today Mrs. Walter F. Frear, president of the Y. W. C. A., presided and told of the plans for raising funds for the association. Miss Helen Salisbury explained the work that is being done for the girls and Miss Annetta Dickson outlined the publicity plans of the association.

Newspaper men of the city were the guests of the Y. W. C. A. The luncheon was in the way of the opening gun of a publicity campaign which will be held from now until the end of January in preparation for a whirlwind three-day campaign to raise necessary funds to round out the association's budget.
