# SCANDAL IN NEW YORK BOXING COMMISSION

## Wenck Placed On Trial On Bribery Charge

The defense that he was the victim of a "frame-up" was made in New York on January 29 by Frederick A. Wenck, chairman of the State Athletic Commission, in a public hearing of charges of attempted extortion preferred against him by three New York boxing-bout promoters.

The promoters, Harry C. M. Pollock, who was one of the State's witnesses in the Rosenthal murder case in New York; Patrick T. Powers and John J. White, all were present; but only Pollock and Powers testified for the complainants. Pollock was the principal witness.

He testified that on November 21, 1916, he interviewed Wenck concerning an effort to obtain a license for a boxing exhibition to be held in Madison Square Garden. At that meeting, he said, Wenck at first claimed that the promoters' lease on the garden was illegal, and later demanded \$1000 to give his permission for granting the license. Pollock also testified that he gave Wenck a post-dated check for \$100 because Wenck told him he was "terribly hard up." Payment of the check and Powers testified for the promoters. His story of later incidents in which the alleged bribe was mentioned was corroborated by Powers.

"When Pollock came to me and asked me to grant the license," Wenck testified, "I told him that he was in bad company. I said that the financial backers of the proposed fight—Johnny White, Billy Long and Frank Farrell—were part of the gang that killed the boxing game in the old Horton law days, and that he had better leave them alone."

Wenck then testified that he had told Pollock the lease was illegal. Subsequently, Wenck said, Pollock declared, "If we don't get this license, we'll give you."
