

# MANY STARS ENTERED IN BIG CARNIVAL SWIMMING MEET TO BE HELD NEXT WEEK

Ross, McGillivray, Langer, Lane, Kruger and Keli Will Compete in 220-Yard Event—Meet Should Be Best in History of Hawaii—24 Events Scheduled for Two Days—Races Will Be Held on Harbor Thursday and Saturday Next Week

Honolulu is certain to witness one of the best swimming meets in history when the natators registered for the aquatic events meet in the harbor on Washington's Birthday and the following Saturday.

The 220-yard event is certain to be the banner card of the meet, as in that event there will be entered John Keli and Harold Kruger of the Healanis, Clarence Lane of the Palama Club, Ludy Langer of Los Angeles, Perry McGillivray of Chicago and Norman Ross of Portland, who will represent the Olympic Club of San Francisco.

Without doubt a new record will be set in this event, as Keli, Kruger, Ross and McGillivray have all made better than world's record time in this event. In the 100-yard swim the race should be between Clarence Lane and Perry McGillivray, although Ross and Keli may show something in the century.

In the 50-yard event Keli, Lane and McGillivray will be the favorites to win. Norman Ross, Ludy Langer, Keli and Kruger should finish in the first four places in the 40, and this race should show a great battle between Ross and Langer with the local boys having an outside chance.
