

DUKE AND DAVE TO GREET MAUI

Duke Kahanamoku, premier sprint swimmer of the world, and David Kahanamoku, another well-known nauticist, will lead the parade in the water carnival welcome to the Maui on Friday morning. Duke and Dave will ride surfboards out to the sea and with ribbons attached to a motor boat will give the first exhibition of surfboard planing in Hawaii.

The two surfboard artists will meet the Maui at quarantine and will give a number of exhibitions on the boards while the doctor is examining the passengers. Coming in to port about 10 outrigger canoes will meet the Maui at the entrance of the harbor and with red and white ribbons, the colors of the Matson line, attached to the bows of the liner, the men in the canoes will tow the liner into port.

Musicians from the Hawaiian band will be seated in the canoes and a number of singers will render Hawaiian songs as the steamer enters the harbor. At this time the whistles on all of the factories of the city will sound their notes of welcome.

This program was outlined at a special meeting of the members of the Hawaiian Promotion Committee today at noon. The committee will plan further for reception of visitors after the arrival of the Matson liner.
