

SWIMMING LISTS CLOSE TOMORROW

Entries For Two-Day Island Title Meet of A. A. U. Are Being Made

After the close of the June meet of the Hawaii Polo and Racing Club tomorrow afternoon the next important sporting competition will be the two-day Island championship swimming meet of the A. A. U., June 22 and 23. There is only one day and one-half left in which to make entries, which close with John F. Soper, chairman of the registration committee, at the Hawaiian News Company at one o'clock tomorrow afternoon. The store will close at one and no entries can be made thereafter.

Kahanamoku Not In

Thirty-seven men had entered for the races up to yesterday afternoon. Duke Kahanamoku was not among them; nor, for that matter, was any member of the Hui Nalus, but there still is time.

The other three leading swimmers of the Islands have entered. John Kelii of the Healanis is down for the 220, 50, 100 and 150 back-stroke. Stubby Kruger, who is known at home but nowhere else as Harold, has entered for the 220, 880, 150 back-stroke, 440 and the relay. He also is Healani. Clarence Lane of Palama is down for the 220, 100 breast-stroke, 50, 150 back-stroke and relay.

Outrigger to Enter

Among others who have entered are Pua Kealoha of Palama for the 100 breast-stroke, 50 and relay; Jack Hjorth of Healani for spring-board diving and relay; Ah Kin Yee of Healani for the 220, 150, 100 and relay; Frank Cunha of Healani for the relay; William Rowatt of Healani for the 880, 440 and relay.

The Outrigger Club will enter a team for the first time. Its entries have not been made yet. Those entered to date are Palama, Healani, unattached and service.

The revised program will be made when all the entries have been checked over.

The receipts of the meet will go toward financing the national A. A. U. championship races here in September, the receipts of which will help send an Island team to the States next year.
