CAMPBELL AGAIN CHOSEN HEAD OF OUTRIGGER

The Outrigger Canoe Club's election last night was a landslide for the Harmony Ticket."

After the smoke cleared away it was found that H. B. Campbell had been re-elected president by a mapority of 136 votes. He got 226 while his nearest opponent, J. Ashman Beaven, received 90.

Not one of the "independent ticket" candidates nosed in. The election resulted as follows: H. B. Podmore received 228 votes for chairman of the order and entertainment commit-tee, against 84 for Charles King; Her-man von Holt got 213 for director, against 114 for F. G. W. Cooper; and J. M. Westgate, also director, polled 194 votes where his opponent, A. J.

194 votes where his opponent, A. J. Porter, got only 93.

Guy H. Buttolph won the vice presidency again without contest; Percy DeverIII was elected secretary, to succeed J. Ashman Beavens, who declined to run again, after several years of hard work in behalf of the club; L. C. Thompson was re-elected treasurer, and Dr. F. C. Mighton was chosen chairman of the house committee. mittee, succeeding E. M. Ehrhorn, who declined the renomination. The retiring chairman of the order and Warren entertainment committee, Dease, also refused renomination.

Two outsanding features of the

election, which was the hottest in the club's history, as seen by various members, are first, that those attendmembers, are first, that those attend-ing and voting last night included members whose community standing is of weight and who want the club to continue to hold the prominent place it now occupies in the commun-ity of life of Honolulu; and second, that the re-election of H. B. Campbell as president represents a vota of conas president represents a vote of confidence in his administration and policies.

Attendance at the election broke all records. Fully 250 men, from the oldest kamaainas down to the young-sters, were present. Annual reports were read by the president, secretary, charmen of the order and entertain-ment and house committees, also the captain. Pres. Campbell read his re-

captain. Fres. Campben read his report after the election was over.

The retiring secretary, J. Ashman Beaven, in his report expressed his heartfelt thanks for appreciations extended him by members during the nearly five years he has held the

secretaryship.
