

CORAL PICKERS AT WAIKIKI ALL DAY

"Every Little Bit Helps" Is Motto For Outrigger Club Members

This is Coral Day at the Outrigger Canoe Club, and in obedience to a proclamation issued by H. B. Campbell, president, all members of the organization and their friends will turn out bright and early this morning to assist in the onslaught which will be made by all throughout the day on the troublesome and bothersome-bits of loose coral which have heretofore made miserable the lives of the patrons of the club who enjoy bathing in the quiet waters "off the beach at Waikiki."

There will be keen competition, especially between the older and younger members of the club, in the friendly race to see who does his or her "bit" better in ridding the Outrigger beach of its strip of coral. Several hundred members and their friends are expected out today, and if each one only lands a chunk or two in the great hunt, the work will be accomplished without much difficulty—just like child play.

Following the lead of the Outrigger Club, it is understood that the Moana people will also have a coral clean-up day all their own. As the two beach resorts adjoin, the affair today will really be a community one, and the day will be made a gala occasion along the two strips of beach.

Speaking of today's plans, President Campbell of the Outrigger club said yesterday:

"We will have a large boat in the water to receive the coral. Arthur H. Hobart, one of our enthusiastic members, has undertaken to secure such a craft, and will have it moved from place to place to gather up the pieces collected by our membership and friends. We will also have a number of canoes pressed into service, and they will assist in the good work. We want everyone to help clean up all the loose coral.

"The outrigger canoes will also be used, and we look for some lively competition in the coral-picking line. If every person visiting the beach on Sunday will pick up one piece of loose coral, the ultimate results will be truly astonishing. Women and children, not to mention mere man, will no longer get their legs cut and their toes stubbed and bruised by the shifting pieces."
