

SWIMMING MEET AT Y. M. C. A. WILL BE FEATURE OF LOCAL ATHLETICS

Swimmers to the Number of 112 Enter Various Events—Duke, Langer, Kruger and Kelii Will Compete in Meet—Service Races Expected to Be Feature—Mermaids Take Interest in Meet, Three Races Scheduled—500 Yard Swim is Listed

Interest in swimming is surely increasing in Honolulu as may be seen in the number of entries for the big swimming carnival which will be held at the Y. M. C. A. on August 8 and 10. There are altogether 112 different persons entered in the meet, which is the largest number to enter an indoor meet in Honolulu.

Altogether there are 21 events on the two nights, including two relays. Duke Kahanamoku, Ludy Langer, Harold Kruger, John Kelii and a number of other local stars will be entered in the various events. This insures the best indoor meet which has been proposed since the swimming events were started in Honolulu.

The young ladies of the city and the service men will be entered in this meet, and the 100-yard open event for women is the only race in which there will not be four or more entered. The Misses Kathleen Law, Gerd Hiorth and Josephine Hopkins will be entered in this event. Miss Ruth Stacker will have a number of the Palama girls entered in the race for girls under 15. The Misses Erma Tarleton and Eleanor Lyser are two entries which have been received for this event.
