

# Harold Castle Elected New President of Hui Nalu Club

W. T. Rawlins Retires as President of Organization and Delegate to the A. A. U.—Club Hears Plan to Erect Clubhouse on Beach Near Outrigger Club—In Accepting Position Castle Urges That All Get Together and Work for Interests of Club

Harold Castle was elected president of the Hui Nalu Club at a meeting held last evening at the Moana Tennis courts. There were no other nominations. A motion was made that the nominations be closed, which was passed. A. L. Castle was elected vice-president. Upon the nomination being made, he asked to be excused, but the members of the club made his election unanimous.

Harold Castle was also elected as a delegate to the A. A. U., succeeding W. T. Rawlins in both positions. This means that Rawlins will automatically retire as president of the A. A. U. after the election in September.

Other officers elected at the meeting last evening were Thomas Treadway, auditor; Robert Purvis, secretary; George Brown, treasurer; Kiniau Evans, captain, and Duke P. Kahanamoku, commodore. The delegates for the coming year will be Harold Castle, Dude Miller and Charles Stillman.

Following the election of officers A. L. Castle proposed that Rawlins remain as one of the delegates, but the former president of the club announced that inasmuch as he had been repudiated by his own club, he did not feel like accepting the position.

## A. A. U. Discussion.

Entirely unexpected the present A. A. U. discussion was brought up when Rawlins denounced a number of the men who had been opposed to him.

Glenn Jackson came in for most of the attack, but the talk had no bearing on the actions of the club, and it was seen early that Harold Castle would be elected president. There wasn't much of a fight put up, and except in the conversations dealing with personalities, the meeting was not such a riot as was expected. The steam roller went merrily along the way, and only one nomination was made for each office.

In accepting the position as president Harold Castle said that he was pleased to accept the honor, and would do everything possible to assist in building up the club. With a reorganization he hoped to see the Hui Nalus one of the liveliest organizations in the city.

Castle made a big hit with the members when he announced that there was a plan on foot to secure a home for the club. He announced that the Territorial Hotel company had offered to give the members a site on the beach free for five years. The site is at the point where the stream empties between the Moana hotel and Outrigger club. It is considered that this would be an ideal place for a clubhouse.

The president will appoint a committee to investigate the details, and if arrangements are satisfactorily completed, it is expected that the clubhouse will be erected at a cost of \$4000 or \$5000.
