

SWIMMING FINALS TO BE HELD TONIGHT

Hundred-Yard Men's National Championship Main Event In Evening's Program

The last of the three-day swimming meet will be held tonight at the Naval Slip, beginning at seven-thirty. The Hawaiian Band will be in attendance.

The feature race will be the second of the evening, the 100-yard national open-water championship in which are entered Duke Kahanamoku (Hui Nalu); Norman Ross (Olympic Club of San Francisco); Abe Siegel and D. Leslie Jones (Illinois Athletic Club); Clarence K. Lane (Palama), and John Keli (Healani). This race should be Kahanamoku's, with Lane and Ross fighting it out for second place, although there are those who predict that Lane will be first at the finish.

Also important races will be the fifty and four-forty for ladies. In the former Dorothy Burns is picked to win, with Claire Galligan second. In the longer race the fight will be between these two, with possibly Frances Cowells springing a surprise. None of the Island girls is figured as a possible winner, although their gameness is to be commended. The experience will stand them in good stead for future meets.
