

# MERMAIDS BEGIN ACTIVE TRAINING FOR 'Y' MEETING

In the girls' swimming meet to be held in the Y. M. C. A. tank on Saturday evening, October 27, there will be events for every type of swimmer for almost every distance. Features are the 25-yard race for girls under 10 and the relay race for school girls. The committee is anxious to have at least two entries from the various schools in the city. Betty Rawlins, aged 6, has been asked to swim an exhibition back stroke.

The swimming girls of the city have commenced active training for this meet. Punahou will have several entries, the Outrigger Club will put in their best swimmers, the Kunalu Rowing Club will be represented and Palama Settlement will have a number of entries.

Several dark horses have commenced to peer out into the light, one being Maona Peters of Punahou, another, Maile Stone, of Kawaihao seminary and another, Yoshino at Palama Settlement.

Entries for the meet will close on October 20 and are to be made to Miss Marjorie Capps at the Hawaiian News Co. The races will include a 50-yard novice, 100-yard open, 25-yard for girls under 10 years of age, 50-yard for girls under 15 years of age, 50-yard open, 100-yard novice, 220-yard swim, plunge for distance, 50-yard back stroke, diving, 50-yard breast stroke, and a club relay.
