# "Y" TO PLAY FIRST INFANTRY SATURDAY

## Schuman-Cavalry Game Scheduled For Sunday Here Not To Take Place

The football situation in Honolulu is still considerably muddled up.

The next Oahu Football League game is scheduled to be played next Saturday afternoon at Schofield Barracks between the First Infantry team of that post and the Y. M. C. A., eleven of this city. An attempt was made last Sunday to have this game played at Moiliili instead of out at Schofield, but this fell through.

Samuel F. Nott said yesterday, however, that Harry Melim's Townies would most likely play a Fourth Cavalry eleven or a team of Marines from Pearl Harbor next Saturday afternoon at Moiliili Field. It is almost certain that a game between the Melimites and some other team will be arranged for that date and place.

### No Sunday Game Likely

The game scheduled for next Sunday afternoon at Moiliili between the Fourth Cavalry eleven of Schofield Barracks and the "Scotty" Schuman Town Team will probably not come off, for Schuman is still shy a number of players on whom he relies a good deal.

Noble Kauhane, whose parents had prohibited playing football this year, received a letter Saturday from his folks in the Big Island withdrawing all objections and permitting him to play. Should the Schuman Townies be able to get together again Kauhane will be available and he will take the place of Hustace Kahikina with the Townies.

Bill Inman and Bill Paty of the Schumanites are still on the list of wounded and injured, but they will be able to get back into the fight should there be a game next Sunday.

### Coast Defense Pau This Year

That the Coast Defense eleven will not play any more games this season goes without saying, for this team has played its full quota of games and as it is neither at the head of the league nor a runner up it cannot figure in the championship game scheduled for Christmas or New Year's Day.

At that the Coast Defense suffered a sad blow through the death of young Calvin Irwin, its quarterback. The story of the accident and death was printed in The Advertiser yesterday. Calvin was a private in the Ninth Company, C. A. C., of Fort De Russy. He was unmarried, a native of Kansas and twenty-one years old, according to the death certificate filed yesterday in the bureau of vital statistics of the territorial board of health.

### Irwin's Death Certified

A coroner's inquest was held over the body of the dead player yesterday at the city morgue. The death certificate, filled out after the inquest, gives the cause of death as "exsanguination following rupture of left kidney, accidentally received in football game, Moiliili Field, December 8, 1917."

The body of the deceased will be sent in the next transport for burial in the mainland.
