With prospects bright for a successful A. A. U. meet this year the members present at a meeting held at the office of W. T. Rawlins yesterday afternoon decided on March 30 as the date for the big event. The Cornell relay will be staged Saturday, March 9. The practise meet between Kamehameha and the Waikiki club will be held on March 16 at Kamehameha field, and the interscholastic meet will be held on March 23 at Alexander field.

At the meeting yesterday it was decided to stage a five mile run. There was some opposition to the hammer throw and discus, but it was decided to stage all the events. The majority of representatives present favored staging the five mile run.

Lorrin Andrews was appointed a committee of one to make arrangements for the financial end of the meet. He will make an effort to secure from firms in the city funds to bear the expenses of the meet. A navy team from the marines will be entered in the meet this year in addition to the Pan-Pacific, Honolulu, Athletic Club, Outrigger Club, Waikiki Athletic Club and 25th Infantry. Hilo athletes are also expected to come to Honolulu for the five mile run.
