

MANY ATHLETES WILL ENTER BIG MEET MARCH 30

Industrial School Boys Will Compete for Pan-Pacific in A. A. U. Track Meet

That the A. A. U. meet will have more entries than ever before in history is the opinion of many of the track enthusiasts of Honolulu. With seven teams entering, numbering all the way from 10 to 30 athletes, there is certain to be a strong field, and as far as attendance goes the meet this year is certain to outdraw any other meet of this kind since the beginning of track.

Joe Stickney paid a visit to the Industrial school yesterday and gathered up three or four stars from that institution for his Pan-Pacific team. Stickney says that he has landed a star five-mile man and a good high jumper. The boys will be allowed to come in for the meet, according to the head of the institution.

Among the stars who are expected to compete for the Pan-Pacific are: Stickney, Kennedy, Given, Cornes, Auerbach, Lydgate, Jolliff, Bill Jansen, Chun Le Puck, Scott, Fukamoto, Podmore, Woolaway, Ishimura, Teregawa, Ha, Wakahiro and Wakuya. It is not definitely known whether Carey, Wright and Hawkins will run. Hawkins said today that he did not intend to run in the meet. Carey said the same a few days ago, but these athletes may change their mind before the meet is staged.

The Honolulu Athletic club will have a number of stars, which will include Meinecke, the great long distance runner; Melim, the speed burner in the sprints; Sid Nicholson, Harold Godfrey, Souza, Auerbach and three or four Portuguese speed burners.

Dad Center will have a number of athletes in the big meet from the Outrigger, including John Watt, Singlehurst, Crozier, Stanley, Smith, O'Sullivan, Lindley, Bromley, Fassoth, Harvey, Rollins, Britton, Higgins and other athletes.
