

HONOLULU CLUB PICKED BY FAN TO WIN EVENTS

Athletic Club Good for 70 Points; Would Beat 25th Infantry Saturday

Dopesters who are making an effort to find out which team will win the meet on Saturday at Alexander field may have more than one guess. According to one of the men who has been following the Honolulu Athletic club, this team is picked to win by a safe margin, although the fans around the city are certain that the 25th Infantry will give Nicholson's crew a good rub.

The Honolulu club athletes will win out by 17 points, according to the follower, and the 25th Infantry will be second. Melim is picked to take 15 points in the dashes, although Corn may give him a run in the 220 yard event. Then with Ferreira in the half mile and mile and Meinecke in the mile, mile walk and five mile, the club should gather a number of points with Ferreira good for at least 8 points and Meinecke will annex 13. Teregawa, who will run under the colors of the Pan-Pacific, may give Meinecke a hard run in the five mile, according to the critic.

Weight Men

In the weights the Honolulu club will have an excellent chance to pick up points. Souza was picked to win the shot put and Nicholson picked to win the discus and hammer throw, with about 3 points in the javelin.

This would give the Honolulu club 18 points there, and with Rodrigues in the javelin and Bortelmann in the shot put and discus the possibilities are bright for 3 more points. There are a number of Portuguese runners who will make a showing in the runs and jumps, and it would not be surprising to see them pick up seven points in the other events, which would give the Honolulu club an even 70. The best that he would give the 25th Infantry was 53 points and the other teams would fight it out for points with the Outrigger, Pan-Pacific team and Waikiki club splitting about even.

Watt Injured?

The president of the Honolulu club said the other night that John Watt was all bunged up and would not do much in the hurdles. Consequently the Honolulu club men are banking on some one to win from the former Cornell star. "Watt is all in," was the statement made by an enthusiast, but the Honolulu club stars and other stars had better watch out, as the Ithaca timber topper might give them a rude awakening.

A member of the 25th Infantry was asked about the chances of their team to win. "We will give the Honolulu club athletes a good run for it, and although they might beat us out we expect to show them something in the various events. Melim may win the 50, 100 and 220, but we have a man in the 50 who will make him run some."

The Outrigger club, Waikiki, Pan-Pacific, Kam, Marines and 25th Infantry are going along with their training, and although the dope shows that the Honolulu club will score 70 points, enough to win the meet, the other teams are hoping that something will happen to upset the dope.

25th Close Up

Figuring the Honolulu club to win the meet, the dopesters of the other clubs would pick the 25th Infantry and Outrigger club to make a good showing, with the Waikiki, Pan-Pacific and Kam close up. In Watt, "Buzz" Smith, Singlehurst, Lindley, Peterson, Rollins and others the Outrigger should make a good showing. Hore, Dower, Kauhane, Decker, Charles Ho and other runners should shape up well for the Waikiki in the runs, and Bert Shannon may startle them in the mile event.

A man who was not affiliated with any of the clubs said today: "According to the rumors I would give the Honolulu club 76 points, 25th Infantry 68 points, Outrigger club 18 points, Pan-Pacific 17, Waikiki 17, Kam 13. The Marines may cut in on some of these points, but their strength is not known."
