

# 25TH INFANTRY TO SEND GREAT TEAM SATURDAY

## Many Believe That Infantrymen Will Beat Out Honolulu Club and Other Teams Saturday

Will the 25th Infantry or Honolulu Athletic club win the coming track meet which will be held at Alexander field on Saturday afternoon? That question was asked many times yesterday, and some of the other club men believe that neither the 25th or Honolulu will win. So there you are.

Some of the 25th Infantry men were in the city yesterday and they felt confident that the 25th would give a good account of themselves. Captain Power is also confident that the Waikiki team will beat out some of the teams, and the same holds good for John Watt of the Outrigger and Joe Stickney of the Pan-Pacific.

### A Question

"For the sake of argument we will concede Melim first place in the 50, 100 and 220," said the 25th supporter. "We will pick up a number of seconds, thirds and fourths, and it might be possible to break in. Then we will do something in the 440. If we give Meinecke 12 points in the meet and the weight men 18 points we can still beat the team. So you can see we are not worrying."

Although John Watt is reported not in good shape and Roberts and Bishop will be unable to compete for the Waikiki club, it would not be surprising to see these teams make a good showing in the coming meet. Joe Stickney has lost Woolaway, but after all it would be a surprise to some fans if one of these three teams beat out either the Honolulu club or the 25th Infantry.

### Kanaha Out of Mile

Both Wade and Benefield of the Waikiki club have been practicing for the meet, and it will be up to them to show something in the middle distance runs. Kanaha will not run the mile for Kam in this meet, which will give Simonton an excellent chance to break through with a good place.

From reports received from the various clubs they are all out to win, but neither are making any claims. Joe Stickney says that his Pan-Pacific team can't win, but they will make the others go some. John Watt maintains that he will not do much and is not claiming a victory for the Outrigger. Weston Dower said that he was out to win, but was well aware there was strong opposition.

Looking at the situation from the standpoint of what the athletes can do, the 25th Infantry team looks like a favorite, although it may be true that the Honolulu club has something up their sleeve. Melim has made 22 4-5 and 10 1-5, which gives his team some right to claim something for him.

### Watch Outrigger

On the other hand the Outrigger will have a strong team in the field, with Watt, Smith, Singlehurst, Britton, Lindley, Peterson, Rollins and others, and it is possible that this aggregation might beat out the Honolulu club for first or second place.

Then one must figure the athletes from the Waikiki club. Dower, Kauhane, In Bun Hee, Charles Ho, Shannon and the weight men should do something. Ludlam and Granrose ought to chalk up a few points on Saturday, and it is barely possible that these athletes will finish well up in the running. The Pan-Pacific and Kam also have good material and may upset the dope.
