

Outrigger Likely To Withdraw From A. A. U. Track Meet

The Outrigger Canoe Club team may withdraw today from the A. A. U. meet scheduled for tomorrow. There was an insistent rumor all yesterday to this effect and those closely allied with the Outrigger would not deny it.

It will be a hard blow to the success of the meet tomorrow if the Outrigger withdraws at this late hour, for its example may be followed by at least two or three other clubs.

The Outrigger swimmers may also decide shortly not to have anything to do with meets staged under the auspices of the A. A. U. There has been a lot of talk to this effect.

May Result in Landslide

At least five of the teams entered for tomorrow's track meet are said to be greatly dissatisfied with what they claim was an arbitrary ruling made by the A. A. U. officials recently in regard to certain athletes, while in the case of one club it is understood that the line was not drawn in the same manner. All this, say those among the dissatisfied, will shortly result in the formation of a Hawaiian League which will take under its wing all local sports of the amateur variety. It is believed that five of the foremost clubs in the city may do this unless the present situation clears up perceptibly.

Moderation is advised, for there should be some way for all sides coming together on the disputed points, for the rule of compromise works well in most cases.
