

THREE TEAMS TO BATTLE IN MEET THIS AFTERNOON

Outrigger, 25th, and Waikiki Clubs Are Picked to Lead; Records Certain to Go

Picking the winner of the A. A. U. track meet, which is being held this afternoon, is like finding a needle in a haystack. You turn one way and find one team looking the best, and turn another and find a different angle. Reports from various camps have upset the dope, and one knows hardly where to start in.

The Honolulu club believes that they will score so many points. The Waikiki and Pan-Pacific are picking so many, and there the situation rests. Looking at the meet from every angle the 25th Infantry, Outrigger and Waikiki look like the three place teams. This in the face of the claims made by followers of the Honolulu club.

Sixty Points to Win

The team which scores more than 60 points will without doubt be the winner. If that many points is needed to win, the 25th Infantry and Outrigger look the best, but the Waikiki team may pick up enough thirds and fourths to place them in any one of the three places. They should have enough to beat out Pan-Pacific, Honolulu, Navy and Kam.

The Navy is an uncertain quantity. They may score five points, and again may score 40. It is certain that they will eat into the Waikiki club points more than with any other team.

If one leaves the Navy out of consideration there should be a hard fight for points in the 50, 100, and 220. There will be 33 points scattered among these three events. Melim will be the heaviest point winner for the Honolulu team in these events; Given will take care of the Pan-Pacific, and Smith is expected to score for the Outrigger. The 25th Infantry and Waikiki will have a number of men, but it is not expected that they will gather any more points than the others if they make as much. Waikiki should score at least 5 points in the sprints.

In the 440, 880 and mile the points will again be split with the Outrigger, 25th Infantry, Honolulu, Pan-Pacific and Kanehameha fighting for honors. Waikiki should score about three points in these three events. The other teams should have more than this.

Navy May Surprise

In the hurdles the Outrigger Club looks the best for the majority of points with the Waikiki Club second. Here the navy may upset the dope somewhat. The Outrigger Club looks best in the pole vault and high jump. The 25th Infantry ought to score heavily in the broad jump.

When one comes to the weight events then there is another question. The 25th Infantry looks good for the shot put, and may pick up points in other events. The Honolulu Club with Souza, Nicholson and Bertelmann should break through with points. It would not be at all surprising to see the Waikiki Club take the majority of points in the weights with such star athletes as Ladlam, Granrose, Butler, Western, Sterling, Penoku, Willing, Geramos and others.

The mile walk looks safe for the Pan-Pacific with Scott in it, but Meinecke ought to be right close behind him. Chun Lee Puck is good, but Peter Neves must be depended upon to do something. In the five mile run it looks like a toss up with such stars as Meinecke, Shannon, Teregawa, Edward Ha, Kano, Prisbela, and Stanley Carey entered. The Pan-Pacific looks good in this race, but the Waikiki, Honolulu and Asahis also have a chance. Carey is unattached, and is always dangerous. The relay looks like a race between the 25th Infantry and Waikiki teams.

At a special meeting of the Council of 13 the following dope was handed out in answer to that of yesterday. It gave the following points: Waikiki 61, Honolulu 49, Outrigger 48, Pan-Pacific 16, 25th 11. The dope, not figuring on points made by the Navy and Asahis, would be as follows, according to the O. O. U.: Outrigger 45, 25th 41, Waikiki 41, Honolulu 32, Pan-Pacific 30, Kanehameha 7.
