

KOREANS CLIMB IN VOLLEYBALL

Still Leading League With-
out a Loss

Last night in the games' hall of the Y. M. C. A. the two Army teams lost their scheduled games: The H. Q. 2nd Infantry lost the first game of the evening to the Kakaako Mission in two straight sets of 15 to 7 and 15 to 4. In the second game of the evening the Korean A. C. demonstrated that the writer was sure there when he announced them as one game bunch at a time when they were occupying the cellar position, for they trimmed the Signal Corps last night in easy fashion, 15 to 3 and 15 to 4.

Apau was the high scorer of the evening, scoring ten points but weakening his season's average by making two serving errors as he drove the ball twice into the net, once on his second serve in the first game and again on his first serve in the second game after scoring seven straight points. Coleman and E. C. Chung fattened their averages by serving faultlessly, the first getting eight points out of eleven serves and the last named getting nine points out of fourteen serves, neither man having any errors charged against them.

Strong Start and Weak Finish

In the first game the H. Q. team started out very strong, scoring five straight points and holding the Mission Boys at zero, but when the Kakaako team did get going it was pau for the army team, as the Mission players played rings around their opponents.

In the game between the Signal Corps and the Koreans the Signal men played a fine game in spots, the trouble being that they did not have enough spots and, consequently, never were dangerous to the Koreans.

The great trouble with the Signal team is that they make the one big mistake continuously of passing the ball low, which puts the men at the net at a serious disadvantage of getting the ball over or being able to make net drive. This criticism also holds good concerning the Headquarters team. Brosh, because of this poor style of passing, is not able to be the tower of strength to his team that he would otherwise be if his team mates would change their style of play.

On Friday night the P. B. C. and the Palamas meet in the first game of the evening and the Outrigger C. C. and the O. P. A. C. play the second game, the first game to start at half-past seven, and the second at half-past eight.
