The largest crowd that has yet attended any of the Oahu Volleyball League games thus far played turned out Friday night and witnessed the fastest and most interesting game ever played in the Y. M. C. A.

The fast O. P. A. C. lost to Palama 15 to 4, 13 to 15 and 15 to 8. The Palamas won because they played a better game and kept playing it from start to finish.

In the first set the Palama boys started out at a terrific pace and kept it up, running up twelve straight scores before the O. P. were able to get a point. The O. P. men worked hard and managed to score three more before the Palamas made their fifteen.

Some idea may be gained as to the quality of ball that was played by the number of serves; one hundred and ten and but three of these were misses, one charged against Amoy, one to Pabana and the other to Roberts.

Brush and Parker were easily the stars of the entire game and both of these men in the first and last set set a pace for their teammates and carried the O. P. men off their feet. The two men who did the best work for the O. P. were Gregory and Pabana.

Jarrett's Proteges Game

After losing the first set, the O. P. ran up four points and held the Palamas scoreless; then were overtaken and the score stood six-all. The lead was first held by one and then the other side. After the score was ten-all the O. P., by fast clever playing, ran it up to 14 to 10, when the Palama men braced up and by fighting hard scored three more but Gregory won the last point and the set for his team by a hard driving cut that Roberio could not reach.

In the third and last set the Palamas started a cross net return play that soon shook the defense of the O. P. and then alternated their style with hard net cuts. At the end of the seventh inning the score stood six to one in favor of Palama. At the end of the fourteenth Palama had increased the lead to 11 to 3.

Then the ball passed from side to side without any scoring five times when the Palamas once more broke to 13 to 3. At this stage Leslie went in to serve and scored five points before he was retired, due to the fine net playing of both Pabana and Gregory.

With the score 13 to 8 Amoy, serving for Palama featured in some of the prettiest playing of the entire game. Three times it looked as if the Palamas would lose the ball but each time it was recovered, and relayed back over the net and then Parker made a fine one hand cut and scored a point. A moment later he scored the last point on a similar but much more difficult play, and the game was over.

Brush Some Player

Lionel Brush, Palama captain, also led both teams in the line of scoring getting thirteen points out of sixteen serves. Leslie was second with ten out of sixteen.

Palama has but one more game to play and that is with the Outrigger C. C. next Wednesday night and even should the Outriggers win they will only be tied with Palama while a win over the Outriggers will give the Palamas undisputed title to 1918 Volleyball championship.

Tomorrow night the O. P. A. C. meet the P. B. C. in the first game and the Kakaako Mission and the Koreans tangle in the second.

Wednesday will close the season with the Outriggers and the Palamas playing the first game and the O. P. A. C. and the Kakaako Mission playing the last game of the night and the season.
