

# BIG FAIR MEET TO BRING OUT SEVERAL STARS

## Track and Field Meet of June 15 to Be Regular Affair; All Teams Show Interest

Track and field enthusiasts are beginning to ask themselves about the probable outcome of the big meet of Saturday, June 15, at Kapiolani park. The great number of entries and the unusual amount of interest being shown are ample grounds for presaging the biggest track and field meet in the history of the Hawaiian islands.

### Club Rivalry High

A good share of the interest in the coming cinder classic hinges on the prospective showings of the various clubs entered. Of course the 25th is the big favorite at present and there is real justification for picking the lively regimentals for first honors. They have been tried and have not been found wanting. Captain Carr is working out with his speed merchants daily and is being assisted in the work of getting the various stars in shape by Lieut. W. C. Ross. Robinson and Simon, the stars of the April A. A. U. meet, are in excellent shape and say that they are out to show some of the local runners how to step in their favorite events.

### Melim and Meinecke

The Honolulu Athletic club has a pretty fair aggregation of tracksters lined up and may figure in at the final counting. The big aces of this organization are Clifford Melim, Bill Meinecke and "Piper" Rodrigues.

All three of these men carried away medals in the last meet and Melim and Meinecke were two of the bright stars of the day. Melim is picked by many to be the man that will wrest the sprint honors away from the 25th. His work in the April affair was sensational and many dope him to land fifteen points out of the short distances. Meinecke, of course, will have to be reckoned with in the mile, five-mile and the mile walk, while Rodrigues should lead the way in the javlin throw.

### Outrigger Looks Good

The Outrigger will have a real team entered, according to Dad Center, and this lively crew figures to make somebody sit up and take notice. John Watt will again be the coach of this team and will train the various men in their events. "Buzz" Smith in the quarter, Rollins in the high jump, Lindley and Bromely in the pole vault and jumps are some of the star performers of this outfit. There is a rumor afloat in athletic circles to the effect that Joe Stickney, the erstwhile Pan-Pacific mentor, will appear on the 15th in an Outrigger suit.

The Asahis will enter a team and should make a strong bid for first honors in the five-mile grind. It is not known for certain as yet whether the various service organizations in the island will enter teams or not, but there will probably be representatives from the marines, the Department Hospital, Fort Shafter and the several forts.

### Waikikis to Shine

The Waikiki Athletic club, which made such a splurge in the April meet, will be among those present at the June 15 affair, and with the addition of several stars is in a fair way to cop first place. Eaton, the well-known Kamehameha half-miler, has been signed by the Waikiki authorities, and several other lads from Kam, including Kanuha, Taylor and Uwe-Loa, will run under the colors of the flying W. Other stars of the Dower-Wyman-Hore combination are Kan Leong, In Bun Hee, Luis, Ludlam, Granrose, Pogpe, Poepoe, Mahikoa and Takeo Teregawa, the ten and five mile champion of the territory.
