

# A. A. U. FAIR TRACK AND FIELD MEET MAIN AFTERNOON ATTRACTION

## Heroes of the Cinder Path, Pit and Weight Throwers To Compete Today At Kapiolani Park—Many Rival Clubs Out For Supremacy

Promptly at one-fifteen this afternoon on the track in front of the grandstand in Kapiolani Park the first of the special A. A. U. track and field meet of the Territorial Fair will be sounded and a quarter of an hour after that Hawaii's greatest cinder path day will be underway. Organized under the colors of the rival teams are the greatest athletes in the Islands—over 200 of them. Gains of victory are rife. Some say Major Carr's Wreckers of the Twenty-fifth Infantry Club to carry the major portion of the points. "Dad" Center and John Watt II can see nothing in the clear heavens above old Leahi but the Ostrigger Canoe Club. O. P. Sauer, just back from a mainland junket, really thinks the Honolulu Athletic Club has a chance, and Sidney Nicholson is of the same mind.

### Special Bleachers Provided

The field events will be held across the track from the grandstand, in full view of all. Bleachers will be erected this morning, affording those who cannot find seats in the grandstand a chance to see the events without obstruction.
