

# WOMAN QUESTION ALMOST DIVIDES CLUB'S MEETING

## Plan to Build Dressing Rooms For Wives of Outrigger Members Starts Row

When J. Morton Riggs introduced a resolution Saturday afternoon at the Outrigger Canoe Club's annual meeting which if carried would have required the directors to build at once not less than eight dressing rooms for those wives and daughters of members on the waiting list of the Woman's Auxiliary bathhouse organization, he precipitated the hottest discussion of the session.

Riggs asserted that his wife had been on the auxiliary's waiting list two years, and that he knew of other wives and daughters of members situated the same way. His motion divided the members into two factions, one for his plan, the other against it. An amendment offered by H. P. Agee, referring the matter to the directors for their serious consideration, carried by a vote of 50 to 43.

G. D. ("Dad") Center also created excitement by saying he would not accept the position of captain unless he were given authority to "hire and fire" steersmen for outrigger canoes on a business basis. Discussion showed members to approve of his suggestions.

Alexander Hume Ford had some pointed remarks to make relative to buying more outrigger canoes. President G. H. Tuttle said there were no more to be bought, and that if anyone knew of any for sale, the club would be glad to buy them. Roger Rice suggested that the club buy half a dozen or more surfboards for members.

The club moved a vote of thanks to H. F. Wichman & Company, Ltd., for the gift of the big clock which formerly stood in front of the firm's location on Fort street. The time-piece arrived Saturday at the club and was installed. J. A. Beaven was given a standing vote of thanks for his gift of a large American flag for the club's Waikiki flag staff. He suggested a Hawaiian flag for the Ewa staff, and members in one minute subscribed the necessary cash for it.

President Tuttle in his annual report said the work of filling the lagoon will soon be begun and will cost between \$3000 and \$4000. The report of Secretary J. A. Beaven showed a gain of 53 members for the year. The club now has 722 members, of which 612 are senior and 110 junior.

The report of Treasurer L. C. Thompson showed receipts for the year to have been \$13,065.18, and expenditures \$11,527.71, leaving a cash balance on hand of \$1440.47.

Permission was given L. Fullard Leo to hold lectures and demonstrations at the club with the purpose of forming a local branch of the Humane Society of London, a life-saving organization.

## JAMES LLOYD NAME OF NEW BARGE FOR HEALANI OARSMAN

The Healani Yacht and Boat Club will give its new six-oared barge its first tryout this afternoon. The boat has been named "James Lloyd." It was built by a Japanese contractor and is of the same make as the Kulamanu. Seats and foot grips of the Kulamanu have been removed to the new boat, as the old one will be given an overhauling in the near future.

When asked about the new barge, Charley Brown, rowing captain of the club, said: "One never can tell how good a boat is until she goes on the water. Our new boat looks as if she will work O. K., but I can say nothing until I have seen her on the water."

A crew will be picked this evening to try her out, and the members expect even greater results from her than the Kulamanu. The Iwalani, now in Hilo, will soon arrive from the Crescent City, making altogether four barges in the boathouse. Either the James Lloyd or the Kulamanu will be used on Regatta Day.
