The First Hawaiian Infantry and Coast Defense teams will make their initial appearance in scheduled games. The fans will have a chance to see what Gilbert Canario, the point-getter of the Signal Corps, can do when playing against a real team.

The Outrigger Canoe Club and Signal Corps will come together in the first battle of the afternoon, and the Coast Defense and First Hawaiian Infantry will fight it out in the second contest.

Lieut. David Desha, the new athletic officer at Fort Shafter, will have his First Hawaiian Infantry five on hand on time on this occasion.

A handful of fans saw the Marines hand an awful beating to the College of Hawaii in yesterday's regular basketball game of the Oahu-Service Athletic League series on the Moiliili Field court.

Adkins and Magee proved too fast and too steady in shooting baskets for the Manoa five. Coach Crawford's collegiates are barely acquainted with the game as it is played with real dyed-in-the-wool navy stars.

The marines won by a score of 83 to 15 points.

Adkins was the star of the match, caging 16 baskets from field and one from goal for 33 points, and Magee also went some, for he caged 10 baskets for 20 points. Williams contributed 10 points with five baskets. Mesford and Dooley got four baskets each for eight points apiece, while Bash threw two baskets from field for four more points. This was all the scoring made by the Marines.

#### Kan Leong Whole Team

The College of Hawaii team consists of Kan Leong, the all-round athlete. There are some others somewhere in the team but they were not working yesterday. Kan Leong caged 5 baskets, from field, making two-thirds of the College of Hawaii score. McTaggart happened to cage a basket from field and one from foul and was credited to him, really and truly, for three points, while Thompson actually dropped the ball through the iron rim and fish cord net once from field for two points.

Coach Crawford says his boys will do better next time. The fans are hoping they will.

The first game was an exhibition one and it served to exhibit how nicely the Coast Defense team plays the basket. They defeated the Fort Kamehameha aggregation by a score of 46-7. The Rams worked over time getting their seven points.

#### Lieutenant Wells a Star

Lieutenant Wells, while not securing the greatest number of points for his team, was easily the star of the match through his footwork and passing. He has the science down pat, surely, and his work was a revelation. He caged seven baskets from field for 14 points. Levenson was the real point-getter, making 10 baskets from field for 20 points. Malone did not seem to be in his real form. He came through with five baskets from field for 10 points, and James succeeded in getting the ball from field into the basket once, for two points.
