#### Yesterday's Results

Signal Corps 28, Outrigger Club 16.  
Coast Defense 60, First Hawaiian 9.

In yesterday afternoon's basketball double-header of the Oahu-Service Athletic League staged on the Moiliili Field court the Signal Corps won a scrappy game from the Outrigger Canoe Club, 28-16, and the Coast Defense defeated the First Hawaiian Infantry easily by a 60-9 score.

Canario, the Signal Corps center, starred in the game against the Outrigger five, caging 10 baskets from field and two from foul for a total of 22 points. Dwyer, right forward, getting the credit for the remaining six points of this game for his team on three baskets from field.

Auerbach was the point-getter for the Outrigger five, caging six baskets from field and one from foul for 13 of the 16 points made by the wearers of the flaming shirts. Harvey caged one basket from field for two points and Decker one from foul for one point.

#### Lanky One a Feature

A feature of the game was the playing of Johnson, the lanky Outrigger center. The manner in which he tangled himself and members of both teams in some of the melees that resembled tame football scrimmages delighted the fans a good deal. He was the attraction of the afternoon.

Lieut. David Desha, athletic officer at Fort Shafter, got five men together yesterday shortly before noon. They learned the game in 30 minutes and met defeat later on at the hands of the Coast Defense, 60-9.

The Shafterites went scoreless in the first quarter, but in the second quarter, out of the pity of his heart and the fact that he had lost his bearings, somewhat due to the changing of sides, James, left guard of the Defenders, caged a ball on his own side of the court. He got credit for the basket, but the two points went to the First Hawaiian. Before that Johnson of the Shafter crew tried the same stunt on his own basket, but his aim was not good and it all went for nought.

#### Levenson Basket Eater

Levenson caged 10 baskets for the Coast Defense five, making one-third of the total score for the side. Wells, Rankin, Malone and James also did their "bit," which all counted, but, really, Levenson alone could have taken care of the opposition.
