

RUNAWAY SCORES FEATURE BASKET WEEK-END GAMES

Overtopping scores for the winners was the feature of the two double-headers of basketball staged over the week-end by the Oahu Service Basketball League at Mollili park. Fair crowds attended the games both on Saturday and Sunday.
