## In Short Practice Scrimmage

# SURPRISE ON O. C. C.

Punahou's Interscholastic hopes walked over the Outrigger football team last evening in a short practice scrimmage on Alexander Field. The Puns scored once via the forward pass route, Searle to Hitchcock, but they were the masters of the situation during the entire scrimmage and were never in any danger from the attack of the Outrigger crew.

The Buff and Blue team looks like a pennant winner and Coach Midkiff is working overtime to put the fighting spirit into the boys. They buckled down in the first few plays and pushed the Outriggers right up the field and then when their backfield needed a rest they relied upon the overhead route and put the ball across the line. The attack looked better than it has for days, Poepoe at full playing an especially strong game. Searle at quarter advanced the ball consistently, and was accurate on the passing. He is a heady little man and is a demon in passing forward passes. Eddie Crowell held down left half last evening and did some nice plunging, until he was knocked out by a fierce tackle. He stopped Hart up short in a long end run but was unfortunate enough to receive a bad kick in the head. Willis and Crozier played the other half position. Crozier will be handicapped on account of an injury to his knee. McGuire, the Puns best bet in the backfield, is out of the game on account of a poisoned leg. He has not been out this week but with a good rest he expects to get in part of the H. M. A. game. The speedy little half would be badly missed if he were not in the Kam game. He will be as fit as a fiddle by Wednesday of next week according to the doctor. On the line the two Lydgate brothers, Mott-Smith, Fuller and Kapakui were a tower of strength on the defense and offense. Kapakui also showed possibilities as a place kick artist for he barely missed goal in an attempt last evening in the scrimmage. Conant and Hitchcock both showed up well at the end positions, being especially strong in catching passes, which is a good asset to go into the Kam game with.

The Outrigger team is composed of old timers but they showed that they still had some stuff left in them and played well in spite of the short practice that they have had. Inman gained on plunges, and Cockett and Hart played hard. With a little more practice and team play the Outrigger Club should have a good team. Quintal and Piper Rodrigues showed to good advantage, the former directing the team just as he did when he held down quarter several years ago on the Buff and Blue squad. Many former Puns were in the Outrigger lineup.

This was the last scrimmage before the H. M. A. game. Next week the College and Puns will again mix it up and the college promises that they will give the Puns a better scrimmage than they did last week.

Football enthusiasm will be rampant at McKinley High School tonight when faculty, alumni and students will join in a monster rally in honor of the football squad and to mark the opening of the Interscholastic season Saturday. The rally will be held at the school, Beretania Avenue and Victoria Street, between 7 and 8 p. m. and there will be songs and cheers and speeches from faculty, coach, players and alumni. The senior boys will also put on a stunt. Alumni are particularly urged to come and take part and get behind the team.

The Black and Gold worked out at Moiliili Field yesterday afternoon and Coach Fritsch labored earnestly to get the team into shape for tomorrow's game. There was signal practice and a short scrimmage and the team seemed to be going well. With the short time at his disposal since the close of the interclass series, Fritsch has not attempted to go into details but has pounded rudimentary football into the team and given them some good fundamental plays.

The loss of Gaspar, who has withdrawn from the team on account of parental opposition, is a hard blow but the McKinley squad has lots of fight and the loss of one man will not take the heart out of the team. The players say they will be in the game from start to finish tomorrow.
