

OUTRIGGER TEAM GIVEN WORKOUT PUNS PROVE FORMIDABLE OUTFIT

Yesterday afternoon Coach Bill Inman and his tribe of surfriders journeyed out to Alexander field and participated in their initial scrimmage of the season against Coach Midkiff's fast Buff and Blue youngsters.

Owing to the delay of the arrival of three or four of the Outrigger men, the 200 fans who were on hand to witness the scrimmage were rather disappointed when 5 o'clock came and there was no sign of a game. However, at 5:30 it was decided to commence the scrimmage, Punahou taking the ball in the middle of the field and the Canoe club with only nine men attempted to stop the rushes of the school eleven. After bucking the line for four or five downs without gaining much ground the Puns completed a trio of forward passes which were successful in netting them a touchdown. The ball was then placed in the middle of the field and as by this time the rest of the Outrigger candidates had arrived on the scene, the surfriders were given an opportunity to try their hand at line plunging.

Backfield Looks Good

The Outrigger backfield, consisting of Quintal, Inman, Hart and Cockett, showed to good advantage. Tom Cockett at left half was easily the greatest ground gainer of the afternoon. Time after time he would skirt around the Puns' speedy ends for 10 or 15 yards before being tackled. Jimmy Hart also demonstrated his ability by plowing through the line at frequent intervals. Inman, after making a few good line plunges was forced to retire from the game on account of an injury sustained to his knee. Gilbert Canario substituted at full, and during the short time he was in the game made a good impression with his line plunging. As the Outrigger club was late in turning out, darkness set in before 20 minutes of play had been completed, which put a stop to the continuation of the scrimmage.

The Puns' line and backfield proved a formidable aggregation for the Waikiki bunch to tackle, but they nevertheless made a good showing in spite of the fact that this was the first scrimmage of the season for the Outriggers. A few more of these performances will greatly aid in conditioning the Surfriders for the game with the College of Hawaii on November 1.

Outrigger supporters were enthusiastic over the showing made by the club after such a short period of training, and are willing to wager anything that when this outfit gets going in the regular senior league series this winter it will take a mighty good aggregation to stop them. The boys are turning out regular for practise each night, and are showing the kind of spirit that spells harmony on a club, which results mean so much when it comes to sportsmanship in any branch of athletics.

Arrival of Sweaters
