

# SOME PROGRESS MADE IN FOOTBALL TANGLE

Two hours' discussion at the headquarters of the Hawaiian Association of the A. A. U. did not bring a definite plan out of the muddled football situation of the club and college teams. Representatives of the College of Hawaii, the Schofield Barracks, Outrigger and Town Teams were present but Schofield had only one unfilled date, Thanksgiving, and other teams had scheduled from one to three games.

One result that did eventuate was the appointment of Principal W. E. Givens of McKinley High School to head a committee consisting of representatives of the various teams interested, which will look into the matter of a schedule, grounds, officials, conditions of play and other details. Whether the teams accept its recommendations or not is a question but there is ground for hope that it may get some action.

Secretary Page of the Schofield Barracks athletic council said that the army teams would not join a league but that they would schedule single games with civilian teams. Professor Crawford of the college was willing to prolong his season after Thanksgiving but not too far and the Outrigger and Town Team representatives wished to begin the season about Thanksgiving and carry on to New Year. They opposed straight A. A. U. control which is not contemplated.

One move was taken which met with general agreement. This was the endorsement of the A. A. U. plan of an official list with some guarantee of the competence of officials. A schedule of fees for officials was adopted placing the maximum for referee and umpire at \$10 each and for head lines

men and field judges at \$5 each.

PORTLAND, Oregon, October 17—(Associated Press)—The 1920 track and field meet and the basketball championship meet has been awarded to the Multnomah Club. The Seattle Y. M. C. A. is given the 1920 wrestling championships; the Spokane Athletic Club, the 1920 handball championships, and the Vancouver Athletic Association of Victoria, the 1920 outdoor swimming championships.

The Crystal Pool Athletic Club of Seattle and the Seattle Y. M. C. A. have been admitted to the Pacific Northwest Athletic Association. The Crystal Pool Club will share the 1920 indoor swimming and diving championships with Multnomah Club, while the Winged M. institution and Victoria will share the boxing championships.
