

COLLEGE MEN TO MEET OUTRIGGER EARLY SATURDAY

Following a conference between the athletic officers of the College of Hawaii football team and the Outrigger Canoe club yesterday afternoon, it was definitely decided that the scheduled game for this Saturday should be played on Alexander field, beginning at 2:30 o'clock. The regular admission of 30 cents will be charged.

It was first proposed to have the game played at Moiliili field as a curtain raiser to the Punahou-McKinley contest, but as the school representative could not come to an agreement, it was shifted to the Punahou field.

First Game

Both teams have been working regularly for the past month but as neither eleven has had a real game it would be of interest to thousands of football spectators to see them mix. The Outrigger bunch is much heavier than the Manoa group, but it must be remembered that there are some heady men on the Crawford team. Captain Brash will return to the game and his presence on any team is always a hit with the fans.

Captain Inman of the canoe paddlers took his men to Punahou yesterday for a scrimmage workout while Coach Crawford had his men stacked up against the Kamehameha team at Kalihi. Stiff practise with plenty of lessons in tackling is the daily program given the boys by Professor Crawford. The line is shaping up well and from all accounts the Outrigger team's line will not have anything to put over the collegians. The backfield on each team is about even. Canario, fullback on the Waikiki crew, is expected to do most of the work for his side while Dusky Brash should add strength to the other squad.

Expect Crowd

A large crowd is expected to be out for this battle, as most of the fans who have been supporting the secondary teams have seen them play during the past two Saturdays. Punahou will have a big show against McKinley at Moiliili field while Kams will surely defeat the H. M. A. team at Kalihi. Besides there are hundreds of college supporters who have been waiting to see their team in action.

Rally

The A. S. C. H. this year has been bucking up against a hard proposition as its treasury is very low. This is due to the inability of local football elevens to form a senior football league. The college team will have to go on its own hook and seek games with any team that is strong enough for a good match.
