Besides the two interscholastic football games on the card for tomorrow there will be a major grid contest. The newcomers⁴ are the College of Hawaii and Outrigger club teams, both of which have been working out for the past month to get into real shape. They will play on Alexander field at 2:30 o'clock. Punahou will meet McKinley at Mollili field, while Kams will tackle the undefeated H. M. A. team at Kalihi, the battles to begin at 3:30 o'clock.

The best game of the three should be the one on Alexander field. Both elevens have never met before and the work by the players is expected to be keen and fast. Punahou should walk over the Fighting Micks and win by a heavy score. The same may be said of the Kams bunch. However, the H. M. A. men may spring another surprise and hold the cadets of Coach Borden to a close score.

Coach D. L. Crawford of the College of Hawaii is not boasting of an exceptionally fast team this year. The team will be out to beat the canoe men, although the college crew is greatly handicapped through lack of weight. The average weight is not more than 143 pounds, while on the Outrigger team the average weight is reported to be over 180 pounds. The men under Professor Crawford have been taught the scientific rudiments of the game and they hope it will be a case of "the bigger they are the harder they fall."

The team is well balanced both on the defense and offense.
