

COLLEGIANS OVERWHELM OUTRIGGERS BY 27 TO 7

Fast, Clean Contest Is Featured
By Much Open
Play

HAWAII PLAYER BREAKS LEG IN COLLISION

Canoemen Score First But Crawford's
Proteges Soon
Take Revenge

In a game featured by much open play, the College of Hawaii yesterday broke their tie of a week ago with the strong Outrigger team by defeating the Canoemen by 27 to 7.

Clean, fast football was played throughout and the contest was marred only by an accident to one of the college players, Muratsuka, who sustained a broken leg in a collision with one of the Outrigger players near the end of the game.

Inman's proteges scored first when they obtained possession of the ball on the collegians' 40-yard line and Canario shot a forward pass to Willis who dashed across the line for a touchdown. Canario kicked goal; making the score Outrigger 7, Hawaii 0.

Hawaii quickly evened the score in the second quarter. After gaining 30 yards on a forward pass, Bromley, fullback, tore around the end for a touchdown and Harvey kicked goal. Their second score came when the Canoemen fumbled the ball on their 25-yard line. Crawford's boys promptly grabbed it and soon thereafter pushed Brash over for a touchdown. Harvey kicked goal.

A few minutes later came the third score. Spencer caught Canario's kick on the Outrigger 40-yard line. Harvey shot a pretty forward pass to Thompson who tore across the line. Harvey failed to kick goal. Score: Hawaii 20, Outrigger 7.

Early in the second half, a series of well executed passes netted the Collegians another touchdown, making the score 27 to 7 after Harvey kicked goal.

There was no further scoring.

About 1000 fans saw the game.
