

Fans on Tip-toes Over Coming Gridiron Championship Battle

All Schofield and Castner football fans are on tip-toes for the great game which is scheduled to come off on the Castner gridiron at 3 o'clock next Saturday between the Outrigger Canoe Club squad and the Post Football Team. Many fans are expected to turn out from the city and wayside stations but, contrary to expectations, there will be no special train. Manager Bill Inman of the Outrigger outfit announced yesterday.
