

SCHOFIELD SCENE OF BIG FOOTBALL STRUGGLE TODAY

Post and Outrigger Teams Will
Measure Strength On
Gridiron

ELABORATE PREPARATIONS
MADE FOR SPECTATORS

Outcome of Contest Hard To
Forecast—Elevens Even-
ly Matched

Honolulu will have no major football contests today, the only battle between teams above the interscholastic grade being scheduled for Schofield Barracks, where the strong Post team will entertain the dangerous Outrigger Canoe Club eleven for four fast quarters.

The outcome of this game is difficult to figure on paper. The Post players held the strong College of Hawaii eleven to a 6 to 10 score last Saturday, while the Collegians defeated the Beachcombers by a score of 27 to 7 several weeks ago after having played them a 6 to 6 tie a week previous. On the other hand, the Outriggers romped through the Luke Field team last Sunday to the tune of 27 to 0 while the best the Post warriors could do with the fliers several weeks ago was to defeat them by 14 to 0.

Elaborate preparations have been made by the service men for the game. Fatigue squads were busy on the field all day yesterday getting it in shape for the game. On the east side of the field has been erected a grandstand with a capacity of 3500, and parking space for all automobiles expected extends the entire length of the field on the opposite side. The field itself will be fenced in tightly by a wire fence and no one but officials and players will be allowed inside the enclosure. Even the substitutes' benches will be outside of the wire. Every precaution has been taken to prevent interference with the players by over-enthusiastic fans.

Of course the Maroon and Gold rooters will have their famous hook in evidence and every trooper who has a buck in his pocket is betting that the Post team will give them a chance to use that hook. Under the direction of Lieut. Grumm, yell leader, the soldier boys have prepared a number of new yells which promise to add vim and jazz to the proceedings. The 17th Cavalry band under the leadership of Bandmaster Lipartiti will play at intervals during the game. Handsome souvenir programs have been prepared and will be given to the spectators until the supply is exhausted. The game will begin promptly at 3 o'clock.

Both teams have suffered from injuries to some extent in recent games but promise to have strong line-ups on hand today. Coach Thacker of the Post team has driven his men hard during the past week, paying particular attention to interference, signals and line bucks. Grimes, captain, and Houston, quarter, who starred in last Saturday's game, both suffered considerably from bruises during the week but expect to be in the game.

In the Outrigger aggregation, Hollinger, fullback, has been almost incapacitated by a bad shoulder and has been striving industriously to get in condition for today's tussle. L. Hart, left guard, has been another one of the cripples who says he will be right on the spot when the whistle blows today.
