

OUTRIGGERS DOWN POST FOOTBALLERS BY 12 TO 3

Army Scores First With Field Goal—Visitors Get Two Touchdowns

2000 PEOPLE WITNESS
WELL CONDUCTED CONTEST

Lack of Teamwork Causes Service Men's Downfall—Fumbles Frequent

In a contest featured by fast, clean play, most of it of the aerial variety, the football eleven of the Outrigger Game Club squashed the Post team at Schofield Barracks yesterday afternoon by a score of 12 to 3.

The army men were the first to score when Grimes kicked a goal from field ten minutes before the end of the second quarter from Outrigger's 20-yard line making the score: Army 3, Outrigger, 0. This was the sum total of their scoring, although the Post fans roared valiantly in defiance in their power to give verbal assistance to their team.

It was not until five minutes after the beginning of the third quarter that the visitors scored. After working the ball down the field by line backs varied with passes and end runs, to the two-yard line, Canario was pushed through the center for a touchdown. Bryant missed goal. Score, Army 3, Outrigger 6.

The Game-men's second touchdown came in almost the same manner in the final quarter. Bryant again missed kicking goal. Score, Army 3, Outrigger 12.

For nearly all of the first half the ball was in the center of the field. Each side frequently lost the ball on downs or was forced to kick, and the scrimmage swung back and forth between the two 50-yard lines, the ball being first in possession of the one and a moment later taken by the other. Quite a bit of old-fashioned plunging was tried and although the visitors outweighed their opponents by quite a few pounds the Army had no difficulty in holding the line for awhile. During the second half, however, the service men seemed to lose their powers of resistance and the Benchrombers frequently made big holes in the lines.

Still Lack Team Work.

Although the Post team showed much improvement over its work in the game with College of Hawaii last Saturday, it still lacked teamwork. Hu-tan's interference frequently was too slow for him and as a result the speedy little quarter was unable to make any material gains in his end runs. The interference also was prone to pick on one opposing player, leaving the other ten opponents free to go after the man with the ball.

Fumbles were frequent on both sides, the Outriggers missing several good chances when Thompson, left end, fumbled two long forward passes from Canario. The army team also was an offender in this respect and many of Grimes' long passes went for naught.

Grimes kicked off to Canario on 30-yard line. Brown gained 10 yards around the end and after several futile line backs, Canario kicked to Army's 20-yard line. Army tried kicking the line but Grimes finally kicked to Outrigger's 20-yard line. Willis fumbled Canario's forward pass. Brown went around the end for 10 yards. Hallinger went through center for four yards. Canario's pass to Willis failed. Canario kicked to Army's 20-yard line, where it was caught by Teitel, for the army. Teitel went through center for 10 yards. Canario intercepted Grimes' forward pass but was downed after passing back five yards. The Benchrombers lost the ball by fumbling in a line back. Merrick caught Grimes' long forward pass but fumbled it. The first quarter ended with the ball in the Outrigger's possession on the Army 40-yard line. Army 3, Outrigger 0.

Army Scores First.
Second quarter—Outrigger lost the ball on a forward pass to Conway going 20 yards. After several attempts through center, Grimes punted to Outrigger's 20-yard line. Canario kicked to the Army 10-yard line after several futile line backs. Houston was pushed around the line to yard 10. A big play came in the game. Army puntized off to Grimes. Grimes went through center for 10 yards. Several line backs came in to block the Outrigger 10. The Army's line was Army's penalty. Grimes kicked to Army's 10-yard line. Score, Army 3, Outrigger 0.

Third quarter—The ball was in Army's possession on the Army 20-yard line. After several futile line backs, Army's line was Army's penalty. Grimes kicked to Army's 10-yard line. Score, Army 3, Outrigger 0.

Fourth quarter—Thompson fumbled Canario's pass, but an Outrigger player recovered the ball. Stiefney on a 10-yard around left end. Canario punted to Army 20-yard line. Army puntized for offside just as the quarter ended. Army 3, Outrigger 6.

Final score: Army 3, Outrigger 12.

field to receive the ball. Grimes kicked off to Outrigger 40-yard line. Brown made 15 yards through center. On a fake play, Canario made 25 yards through center. A forward pass, Canario to Anderson, brought the ball to the Army 5-yard line. From there several line backs sent Canario across the line for a touchdown. Bryant failed to kick goal. Army 3, Outrigger 6.

Many Penalties Imposed.

Canario kicked off to Brown on Army 45-yard line. Grimes' forward pass was intercepted by Brown. Outrigger's ball on Army 50-yard line. Stiefney made 15 yards through center. Canario punted to Army 20-yard line. Grimes kicked to Outrigger 45-yard line. Canario's forward pass to Brown netted 20 yards. Outrigger puntized for offside just as the quarter ended. Army 3, Outrigger 6.

Fourth quarter—Thompson fumbled Canario's pass, but an Outrigger player recovered the ball. Stiefney on a 10-yard around left end. Canario punted to Army 20-yard line. Army puntized for offside. Grimes kicked to Canario on Outrigger 40-yard line who ran the ball back to the Army 45-yard line before he was downed. Canario's forward pass to Thompson got the ball on the Army 20-yard line. The second touchdown came a few moments later after a series of line backs, Canario making the touchdown. Bryant missed goal. Army 3, Outrigger 12.

Bryant kicked off to Army 40-yard line. A series of center rushes brought the ball to the Outrigger 40-yard line. A forward pass, Grimes to Conway, netted 10 yards. A line plunge and an end run advanced the ball to the 25-yard line. Another forward pass gained put the ball on Outrigger's 5-yard line. At this point the Outrigger was puntized 3 yards and the ball was on the visitors' two-yard line. The Benchrombers stiffened, however, and for three downs the Army was unable to gain either through line backs or end runs. The whistle saved the Game-men and the game ended with the ball in the Army's possession on the Outrigger one-yard line. Final score: Army 3, Outrigger 12.

Game Well Conducted.

Approximately 2000 persons saw the game many of them being Honoluluans, and the automobile parking space was packed. The game was notable for freedom from kicking, foul play or injuries, and was one of the best conducted gridiron contests staged on Oahu this season. With a big new grandstand capable of accommodating 2500 people, a wire-meshed field, overhanging end posts, ample parking space and many other conveniences, the Post field offers an unusually excellent place for football contests.
