

SCHOFIELD TEAM PUTS UP DANDY GAME WITH O. C. C.

Approximately 2000 people were present Saturday afternoon at the post grid field at Schofield and saw the fast Outrigger eleven defeat the army team 12 to 3, in one of the fastest and cleanest football contests ever staged between civilian and army teams on the island.

For nearly all of the first half the ball was in the center of the field. Each side frequently lost the ball on downs or was forced to kick and the scrimmage swayed back and forth between the two 30-yard lines, the ball being first in possession of the one and a moment later taken by the other. Quite a bit of old fashioned plunging was tried and although the visitors outweighed their opponents by quite a few pounds the army had no difficulty in holding the line for awhile. During the second half, however, the service men seemed to lose their powers of resistance and the Beachcombers frequently made big holes in the lines.

Army First

The army was first to score in final two minutes of play during the second quarter when Grimes dropped a kick between the goal posts from the Outrigger's 20 yard line. With the opening of the third quarter the Canoemen took a new lease of life and romped up the field from the 35 yard line to a touchdown without losing the ball once. The outstanding feature of this drive was the skilful passing of Canario and the playing of Half-backs Brown and Stickney of the Beachcombers. The work of this trio proved too much for the Giants who seemed to lack teamwork for the moment. The Outriggers again scored in the last quarter, when after several long gains on forward passes, plays were shoved through the Schofield middle section which resulted in another touchdown for the club boys.

It was not until the last quarter that the Schofield men threatened to score. A series of spectacular runs by Quarterback Houston followed by several successful forward passes placed the Giants on the Outrigger five yard line. Here the Outriggers were penalized for off side and with two and a half yards to go the stone wall defense of the Outrigger line held them for three downs, when the whistle blew ending the game with the ball in the army's possession on the Outrigger one yard line.
