

# SCHUMANITES WHITWASH OUTRIGGERS ON GRIDIRON

In Fast, Clean Game Town Team  
Rolls Up Thirteen  
Points

**BOTH TEAMS PLAY OLD-  
FASHIONED FOOTBALL**

Victors Lose Star Player When  
Injury Takes Rod-  
rigues Out

Town Team 13, Outrigger 0.  
A field goal booted by Piper Rodrigues, a touchdown by Aarona and a goal by W. Clark and a field goal by Rosa were the net results for Scotty Schuman's strong football eleven in its battle with the Outrigger aggregation and although the battle was a hard one, the Town Team managed to hold its opponents scoreless. About 1000 people saw the battle.

The aerial game of both sides was a failure. Five times the Town Team missed field goals, trying them several times from almost impossible distances. Andrews was responsible for two of the failures and "Buck" Aarona for three. Forward passes also were a fizzle as the ends of both teams were fast enough to block them. Each side made a short forward in the first quarter and then there was nothing doing in this department of the game until the Outrigger made a short one in the last quarter.

Aarona and Thurston were the principal ground gainers for the victors. In fact, during the third quarter the former made practically all the gains that the Schumanites were credited with, smashing through the line time after time until he finally battered his way across the goal line for the only touchdown of the game. Later in the game Thurston tore big holes in the opposition line.

## Line Plunges Used

For the Outriggers Stiekney was the most consistent ground gainer although O'Sullivan made a hole whenever he got the ball. Both teams played old-fashioned football quite a bit and at times neither side had any difficulty in piercing the opposition line.

The Town Team's first score came shortly after the beginning of the second quarter. Thurston intercepted Canario's pass on the Town Team 45-yard line and a moment later made a beautiful run of 35 yards around left end. Crabbe added 10 more yards around right end and then H. Clark dropped back and kicked a pretty field goal from the 35-yard line.

Not long after Piper Rodrigues, star end of the Town Team was hurt while tackling Canario and was replaced by Mitchell. The loss of the speedy end discouraged the Schumanites and the Inman boys for several downs tore through the line without any trouble but a few moments later when the Town Team got possession of the ball through Rosa's catch of Canario's punt, the Schumanites rallied and marched back toward their goal post. Their efforts were in vain, however, for Andrews missed a field goal from the 20-yard line and the Outriggers got the ball. A moment later the end of the half put a stop to proceedings.

## Long Run in Vain

At the beginning of the second half, Monaha, who had replaced Crabbe, caught Canario's kickoff on the 10-yard line and dodging the field ran the full 90 yards back to his own goal and placed the ball behind the posts. The crowd, thinking it a touchdown, went wild, but their cheers turned to sorrow when Referee Zimmerman ruled that Monaha had gone out of bounds at the 50-yard line and brought the ball back to the center of the field. A moment later the Outriggers got the ball when Andrews missed a field goal from the Outrigger 40-yard line. Schuman's boys recovered possession a minute later when Canario kicked out of bounds. Andrews tried another field goal from this distance from the 30-yard line. A little while later Buck Aarona tried his skill at kicking but did no better than Andrews, whereupon the Schumanites fell back on line plunges and used him as a ram to batter their way over the line. H. Clark kicked goal, the ball hitting the cross bar and bouncing over. Town Team 10, Outrigger 0. The quarter ended soon after with the Outrigger team holding the ball on its 35-yard line.

quarter the ball had been kicked and passed up and down the field. Canario made two beautiful throws but the swift Town Team ends made them of no avail, and the Outriggers began to send Stiekney through the line. Canario kicked from the Town Team 35-yard line but the ball hit the goal post and rolled outside. Andrews kicked out to the 50-yard line and then Thurston in successive plunges carried the ball down to the Outrigger 15-yard line where Rosa fell back and kicked field goal for the final three points. The game ended with the ball in the middle of the field.

The Outriggers seemed to stand the game better than their opponents, not one man going out of the line-up because of injuries. They were slightly heavier than the Schumanites. There was no perceptible foul play and no penalties imposed except for offside.
