The bright particular star of the afternoon, despite the fact that he was on the losing side, was "Buck" Aurona. the husky Kamehameha back, who tore through the Outrigger line time after time. Aarona, it was who made the sole touchdown which his club was able to register, following a series of brilliant runs for 10 and 20 yards around the ends.

The first score of the day was made by Teddy Searle, the diminutive Punahou star, who dropped a pretty field goal from the 40-yard line in the last few minutes of play in the first period. The ball sailed squarely between the goal-posts and the Outrigger hosts howled with joy.

Fumbles

Unfortunate fumbles marred the over a touchdown in this quarter and duels. paved the way for a 60-yard scamper by Stickney in the second period through a broken field. Thurston finally ran 'Stickney down, but not until the Outrigger back had crossed the goal line for a score. Searle failed

Aarona went out of the game toward the end of the third quarter, suffering from a twisted ankle; but he came back early in the final period and played a bang-up game to the end.

The general work of Canario, D. Brown, Anderson and Kahanamoku, for the Outriggers; and of Rodriguez, H. Clark, Morgan and Makalena, for the Town club, was worthy of especial mention. Rodriguez had slightly the better of Searle in the punting duels.
