

ENTRIES FOR A. A. U. TRACK MEET WILL CLOSE SATURDAY

Hilo To Send Delegation — Ser- vice Will Enter Many Athletes In Meet

Entries for the annual A. A. U. track and field meet, to be held on Alexander Field on the afternoon of April 10, will close next Saturday afternoon at the A. A. U. headquarters in the Pan-Pacific Building at 2 o'clock. All athletes intending to enter the meet are urged to have their entries in by that time, as no post entries will be allowed.

In addition to the large lists from the Outrigger Canoe Club, the Waikiki Athletic Club, the Braves Athletic Club, and the All-Around Chinese Athletes, it is probable that a formidable list of athletes from the military and naval service will compete. Entry blanks were sent to Schonfeld yesterday and the Marine Corps at Pearl Harbor has asked to have a batch of them.

Word from Hilo to local A. A. U. headquarters is to the effect that the Hilo Yacht Club intends to send a team of eight or 10 athletes to compete in the meet. Blanks already have been sent to the Crescent City and probably will be returned today.

A meeting of the games committee will be held next Monday, April 5, at which it will be decided whether or not tryouts in any of the events will be necessary. The Outrigger and Waikiki Clubs are urging that the trials be held a day or two before the meet but it is not certain that this procedure will be followed. Several of the clubs will hold tryouts next Saturday to determine what men they will enter in each event, as the entries will be limited to four men per club.
